

Information Session with the University of Winnipeg, Canada

orth South University's Office of External Affairs hosted a virtual information session with the University of Winnipeg, Canada on March 1, 2022. The attendees of the meeting included Ms. Mekala Wickramasinghe, Graduate Study Recruitment and Training Officer and Ms. Mavis Reimer,



Dean of Graduate Studies from University of Winnipeg and Ms. Tasnia Azmeri Madiha, Coordination Officer, OEA and Dr. Katherine Li, Director, Office of External Affairs from North South University. The interactive session was conducted through Zoom and streamed via Facebook Live on the official Facebook page of NSU OEA.

The session started with an informative and interactive presentation by Ms. Wickramasinghe about the foundation, location, academic structure, facilities, etc. of the University of Winnipeg. She mentioned that the University of Winnipeg is a 55-year-old well-established university located in the Manitoba province of Canada. Before diving into the details about the university, Ms. Wickramasinghe briefed about the environment and surroundings of the location of the university. The university stands in the heart of downtown Manitoba. The area of the town is culturally very rich; it is diverse and vibrant in every aspect. It has a comfortable and varied weather pattern in different seasons. The place also has a cosmopolitan ambiance with advanced transportation, stores, restaurants, offices and residential arrangements. The economic activities and employment opportunities (voluntary, part-time and full-time) are excellent there as well.



The University of Winnipeg is the second largest university in Manitoba with a student body of 10,000 students, among which 1,500+ students are international students coming from over 90 countries around the world. The university ensures a very engaging and rich student experience for both their local and international students. Alongside the academic excellence, the University of Winnipeg ensures ample scope for interpersonal growth and skill development for its students. The university currently facilitates more than 55 student groups or clubs which enable great opportunities for

participation in extra and co-curricular activities for the students. Moreover, the university is research oriented and has been ranked number 1 for graduate students research output. Besides the regular student facilities, the university provides some exclusive international students services like airport pickup, mentorship programs, social and cultural activities, immigration advice, etc. During her presentation, Ms. Wickramasinghe also informed the audience about their COVID-19 support system which includes hybrid classes, financial assistance, on-campus vaccine clinic, student counseling, online support from international students service and so on.

Next the floor was passed to Ms. Reimer who discussed the academic programs offered by the University of Winnipeg. She focused on the administrative and curriculum structure of the Graduate Programs during her presentation. She mentioned the departments operating under their graduate program, which include Masters of Arts, Masters of Science, professional programs and Environmental Studies. All the programs and courses offered by the university are innovative and multidisciplinary and aim to achieve practical and experiential learning, co-curricular and professional development. Alongside discussing the programs, Ms. Reimer also informed the audience about the financial structure, funding and scholarship opportunities. Moreover, she mentioned the admission requirements, required documents, application timeline and process for applying to their offered programs during the session. Lastly, she provided the contact details of their International Affairs Office for the interested students and encouraged them to reach out regarding any query.

NSU Alumni Talk Show Episode 72



The seventy-second episode of the NSU Alumni Talk Show aired on March 7, 2022. As our guest for this episode, we had Mr. Sohel Islam, a remarkable alumnus of North South University from the Department of Computer Science and Engineering, Batch 1994. He completed his undergraduate studies from NSU in 1998 and received his postgraduate degree from the Georgia Institute of Technology, USA in 2019. In his professional life, Mr. Islam has worked at Microsoft for almost 13 years. Other than that, he also has the experience of working with several national-international software and IT companies such as Safe Works, Samsung Electronics, Augmedix, Shohoj Limited, BRAC IT Services Limited, etc. Currently, he is working as the Software Development Manager of Economics at Amazon Web Service (AWS).

The event started with a discussion about Mr. Islam's professional journey with computer science and engineering. He grew a curiosity about science from a young age and realized his profound interest in programming during high school. Following his passion, he has been involved in software development and marketization throughout most of his career. Right after the completion of his undergraduate degree, Mr. Islam moved to the USA and started his career there. After almost 13 years of staying there, he returned to Bangladesh and joined national IT firms. In his current position at AWS as the Software Development Manager, he has the responsibility of marketing software. His specific department supervises and articulates the procedure of identifying the authentication and authorization of every incoming call in the organization.

As a veteran professional of the software and IT sector, Mr. Islam shared some insights about the skills and qualifications required for the newly hired. He emphasized hard or technical skills like software expertise and soft or interpersonal skills like communication, presentation, confidence, leadership, responsiveness, etc. As the industry is currently highly innovation oriented, he mentioned that creativity is an essential quality to prosper in the IT field. Furthermore, the recent evolution of software engineering is highly related to data science, artificial intelligence, etc. So profound knowledge in these subject areas will give professionals an extra edge in their career. Talking about the innovations in his specific field of specialty, Mr. Islam highlighted the emergence of cloud technology, highly scalable and available technology and stressed on being fully aware of scalable and available solutions for the new engineers.

Mr. Islam has been closely involved with several tech-based startups in Bangladesh for awhile now. So, from his experience, he outlined what he saw the future of entrepreneurship to be in the technology sector of Bangladesh. He emphasized the importance of repetitive trial and error for fail-proofing a new business model. He also stressed flexibility and adaptation adding that alongside genuine ideas, entrepreneurs should take the concept of customization into account while drafting a business plan.

The detailed discussion about Mr. Islam's career and the tech industry ended in reminiscing about memories from his NSU life. While sharing the story of starting his journey with NSU, he described that he had taken a break from formal education for a while after secondary school. Back then, he was deeply invested in new software development and even started a business of his own partnering with one of his college friends. Later on, he realized the need for formal higher education; hence, he chose NSU to pursue his undergraduate studies in CSE.

Mr. Islam's university life was quite eventful and memorable, as he was involved in various co- and extracurricular activities besides his studies. While sharing treasured memories from his campus life, he mentioned his close connections with the faculties. In his words, the extraordinary teaching methods, dedication and helpfulness of the faculties worked as an inspiration throughout his entire life.

NGO Talk Show Episode 12

The twelfth episode of the 'NGO Talk Show' aired on March 7, 2022 with one of the government-registered NGOs of Bangladesh - 'Organization for the Poor Community Advancement (OPCA)'. The name of the event was 'Developing Bangladesh: Scope for research between NSU and OPCA'. We had Mr. Md. Alamgir, Founder & Executive Director, Organization for the Poor Community Advancement (OPCA) with us as the keynote speaker for the event. From North South University, Dr. Katherine Li, Director, Office of External Affairs was present as a Special Guest, and Mr. Mehedi Masud Sumon, Officer, OEA

The event started with Mr. Alamgir's objectives and inspiration behind the foundation of OPCA. He was involved in social welfare based activities from his student life, the continuation of which led him to participate in the relief efforts after the disastrous cyclone in 1991. That particular incident touched him so deeply that he initiated the foundation of OPCA the following year, in 1992, as he felt the necessity of an organizational structure to fulfill his target of serving the society. The organization was registered with the government in 1994. Since the foundation of OPCA, Mr. Alamgir has dedicated two decades of his career to the development sector.

During the event, Mr. Alamgir discussed the projects and activities of OPCA which focus on employment generation. The organization is currently working in sectors like agriculture, value chain and marketing. Besides that, their activities also include health, nutrition, education, women's empowerment, etc. The organization makes an effort to address and solve issues related to gender-based violence, disability and other social problems. Mr. Alamgir acknowledged the support of the government and civil society in their projects and activities as well as the integrated development of Bangladesh.

As the discussion furthered, Mr. Alamgir shared his point of view about the roles of NGOs in the integrated development of Bangladesh. According to him, in the current context of the country, NGOs are working hand-in-hand with the government. NGOs have played an active part in poverty alleviation of the country. Furthermore, these organizations have made remarkable contributions to the improvement and protection of human rights of tribal groups, tea garden workers, autistic people and disabled people. In such cases, the NGOs have been following bottom-up approaches and participatory mechanisms, which are proven to be quite efficient so far. According to the guest, the superpower of these organizations is their reach to the root-level which gives them an upper hand in working actively in most situations.

In the latter portion of the event, the attendees of the session discussed the possible collaboration opportunities between OPCA and NSU. As a fieldwork oriented organization, OPCA has tremendous experience with research; hence, there are opportunities for research collaboration and potential joint research projects. Additionally, Mr. Alamgir proposed internship opportunities, training programs, joint funding, resource sharing, etc. as potential collaboration ideas. He suggested further discussion to create a strategic plan for actualization of the proposed initiatives.

NGO Talk Show Episode 13

The thirteenth episode of the 'NGO Talk Show' aired on March 14, 2022 with one of the government-registered NGOs of Bangladesh - 'Efforts for Rural Advancement (ERA)'. The title of the event was 'Developing Bangladesh: Scope for research between NSU and ERA'. We had Mr. Md. Sirajul Islam, Executive Director, Efforts for Rural Advancement (ERA) with us as the keynote speaker for the event. From North South University, Dr. Katherine Li, Director, Office of External Affairs was present as a Special Guest, and Mr. Mehedi Masud Sumon, Officer, OEA hosted the live talk show.

Throughout the event, Mr. Islam shared the journey, objectives and future goals of Efforts for Rural Advancement (ERA) with the audience. Mr. Islam developed an interest in social work at a young age which is reflected prominently in his In his career choices. He has worked in the development sector for 27 years. His experience and interest in the development sector led to the foundation of ERA in 1997, which later got registered with the government of Bangladesh in 1999. Talking about the projects and



working areas of ERA, Mr. Islam mentioned that the organization runs mostly Sunamganj-based activities. Their areas of focus are health, education, nutrition, water, sanitation, child development, etc. The organization has some experience working in collaboration with international donors as well. One such significant joint project that ERA was associated with is the 'Mutual Learning for Improving Health and Nutrition Scenario' which was funded by the Norwegian Foreign Ministry involving two countries – Bangladesh and Nepal.



According to Mr. Islam, NGOs play a significant role in the integrated development of Bangladesh. He mentioned that NGOs mainly conduct two types of activities – needs-based and rights-based, both of which are equally important for the progress of our country. Needs-based activities generally include natural disaster management, relief work, the Rohingya issue, etc. and rights-based areas include health, education, livelihood, gender equality, environment, climate, etc. In this context, Mr. Islam acknowledged the contribution of civil society in favor of the activities of NGOs. He mentioned that roughly 50% of the development projects of NGOs are supported by the civil society. In fact, the work quality, effective plans, efficient implementation and rapid improvement carried out by the development sector of Bangladesh is internationally praised.

For planning and implementing their general population-oriented projects, ERA often has to conduct extensive research activities. For primary data collection for such projects, Mr. Islam believes that the relevancy of action research is better than commissioned research. The attendees of the event also discussed the opportunities for research collaboration and joint projects

between NSU and ERA. Mr. Islam proposed sharing of resources and primary data, joint funding as some of the ways to actualize collaboration. He also offered the possibility of internship programs for the students of NSU in his organization.

NSU Alumni Talk Show Episode 73

The seventy-third episode of the NSU Alumni Talk Show aired on March 15, 2022. The episode showcased Mr. Zubair Ahmed Quazi, a remarkable alumnus of North South University from the Department of Computer Science and Engineering, Batch 1994. Mr. Quazi completed his undergraduate studies from NSU in 1997 and afterwards, received his MBA from University of Phoenix, USA. In his professional career, he has worked with several national-international software firms like BSM Limited, Cisco, Yahoo, Tego Inc., VMWare, etc. Currently, he is working as the Managing Director of Core Development at JPMorgan Chase & Co., USA. Beside that, he is associated with a number of enterprises as investor or advisor.



Mr. Quazi has a very interesting and highly diversified career portfolio as he has significant presence both in the IT industry and entertainment industry. Among all the IT companies he has been associated with throughout his career, the longest affiliation was with VMWare. He joined the enterprise back in 2006 when it started its journey as a mid-size startup. According to Mr. Quazi, VMWare is more of an emotion for him than a job, as he has witnessed and participated actively in the overall growth of the company, be it with products, employees or revenue. After 15 years with VMWare, he recently left the company and started working for JPMorgan Chase & Co. about 7.5 months ago. Currently, the company is making a combined effort to shift all of their developed software to the Cloud.

Alongside software engineering, Mr. Quazi is passionate about music which led him to co-founding Black Box Studios LA. The venture is still under construction and set to be launched soon, in fact in a week or so. He is also the co-founder of Abol Tabol Studios, a production house for high quality short films on specific topics. This one is also yet to launch, four trial projects of the studio are already ready to be aired. Mr. Quazi has high hopes from both the ventures. He mentioned that these initiatives are purely out of his passion, hence he has no expectation of commercial benefit from these.

Mr. Quazi did and still is acting as investor and advisor of a number of renowned startups and ventures like Bongo, OpenRefactory, bdtax.com.bd, CloudAEye, etc. He has always had a passion for innovative ideas, thus he tries to be involved with innovative initiatives as much as he can. For every would-be entrepreneur who pitches their ideas to Mr. Quazi, he always tries to hear them out. According to him, every one of these brings the opportunity of learning to him. In this regard, he mentioned that he always analyzes and forecasts before associating with any venture. He generally prefers to get involved with the tech-based ventures and entrepreneurs from Bangladesh as he believes that this increases his effectiveness as an advisor because of his experience and relevance with the context.

Throughout the show, Mr. Quazi highly encouraged entrepreneurship for people with innovative ideas and feasible business plans. According to him, Bangladesh has a tremendous future in entrepreneurship given the healthy competition and current ecosystem of the industry. He also advised not to fear failure as failure is the symptom of growth for the economy and industry.

During the latter part of the event, Mr. Quazi reminisced about memories from his NSU life. He shared that he started his undergraduate studies in Industry Engineering in Turkey. Due to a family emergency, he had to return to Bangladesh in 1993. Therefore, he transferred his completed credits from Middle East Technical University to NSU. He mentioned that he had amazing faculties as well as an enthusiastic and talented set of friends in NSU. According to Mr. Quazi, his undergraduate life was how he expected it to be - very eventful, educative and fun. He has enjoyed the positive influence of NSU throughout his whole career and personal life as well. In his words, it was NSU that taught him to believe in himself.

Moreover, the city is 14% more affordable than the other major cities in Australia; it offers ample part-time working opportunities, post-study working permits, etc.

The university is one of the highest ranked universities in Australia as well as in the world. It has been ranked 29th among the top 50 universities of the world aged under 50. 

She completed her undergraduate studies from NSU in 2015 majoring in Marketing. Professionally, Ms. Prova is associated with academia. She has worked in the global education consultancy area with both national and international organizations like PFEC Global, 9DP Education, etc. Currently, she is working as Country Manager of Coventry University, UK.

The event started with a discussion about the professional journey of Ms. Prova.

Although she has been associated with academia from the very beginning of her career, it was not something preplanned. She shared her experience of working in the global educa-

tion sector with the audience. She mentioned that the education sector is hectic and her role and responsibilities regarding her positions require lots of traveling around for meetings and events both inter- and intra-border. Her current responsibility as the Country Manager of Coventry University includes overseeing the agencies, students, performances and participating in fairs.



The main focus of both the meetings was to discuss the partnership and joint program opportunities between NSU and Macquarie University. The delegates proposed arranging on-campus information sessions and seminars as well as study tours for students. The timeline suggested for the seminar is May, 2022 and for the study tour is August, 2022. The attendees also discussed faculty exchange programs for one year and student exchange programs for six months, especially concerning the business faculty. During the meeting, the guests discussed the 'New Colombo Plan' which allows Australian students to visit abroad for academic purposes for a limited period and expressed interest in including NSU as a host university for this program. The meeting ended on a positive note with a decision to reconvene for further discussion.

NSU Alumni Opportunities in Startups

NSU
Startups Next University Office of External Affairs (OEA) attended a virtual discussion session with North South
Startups Next University Startup Next (NSUSN) regarding the opportunities for NSU alumni to collaborate with NSUSN for startups.

Dr. Katherine Li, Director, OEA and Dr. Dr. Shazzad Hosain, Director, NSUSN were present in the event as the speakers.

The event was conducted through Zoom and streamed via Facebook Live on the official Facebook page of NSU SN.

The event started with the introduction of the two speakers of the event. Afterwards, the floor was offered to Dr. Li, who said that every startup project could be seen as "an attempt to solve a problem"; therefore, she appreciated the innovation-oriented and problem-solving approach of NSU SN.

Next, the floor was passed to Dr. Hosain who shared an informative presentation about the operations, objectives and goals of NSU SN. He also addressed the opportunities for the NSU alumni community to join and work with them. In the beginning of his presentation, he introduced NSU SN, described its functions and explained how it supports the startups. The steps that they follow to proceed with any innovative idea are – idea/project submission, idea/project selection, mentoring and graduation. He mentioned that they have already shortlisted four projects this year and are very hopeful about their establishment.

Dr. Hosain also discussed the process of starting and exiting a startup during his presentation. He mentioned that to pitch an idea to NSU SN, the prime eligibility for the entrepreneur(s) is that they have to be an NSU alumni or current student. Alongside the idea, the entrepreneurs are expected to present a prototype as well. The submitted ideas go



through an experts' opportunity analysis and in these cases, industry experiences of the entrepreneur are much appreciated. Dr. Hosain also mentioned that the alumni of NSU can be associated with their organization not only as entrepreneurs, but also as investors and advisors. There are even significant opportunities for partnership for the alumni with the startups that NSU SN besides facilitation.

Lastly, the speaker shared some challenges that they have faced so far in their initiatives and operations, among which he stressed multidisciplinary collaboration the most. Based on his professional experience, Mr. Hasan shared some interesting insights about the impact of Mobile Financial Services (MFS) in the economy of Bangladesh. He addressed MFS as the substitute for banks which has made transaction and financial services easier, especially for the rural people who have comparatively less access to banking services. Availability and popularity of mobile financial services have brought huge changes in the lifestyle of the masses.

As Mr. Hasan has significant experience working in the marketing sector, he shared an overview about the evolution of marketing campaigns in his industry over the years. According to him, the marketing approach has changed significantly in the past few years; before the companies used to adopt a mostly customer acquire-centric promotional approach which has shifted towards more segmentation – digital and data statistics driven approach in recent times. Overall, the strategies have taken an internationalized approach rather than a traditional one.

Besides his professional and industrial experiences, the guest shared his opinion and suggestions about higher studies with the audience. He stressed the importance of getting a Masters degree or professional degree as well as online self-development courses for career development of young professionals. In this context, Mr. Hasan said that "online learning platforms give independence of education". Regarding taking a gap between the Bachelors and the Masters, he mentioned that it completely depends on the different approaches to one's career plan.



As our guest for this episode, we had Ms. Nusrat Hasan, an alumna of North South University from the Department of Business Administration, Batch 2007. She completed her undergraduate studies from NSU in 2010 majoring in Marketing and Human Resources Management. Ms. Hasan has built her career in the marketing sector and has worked in leadership positions of marketing departments of renowned companies like Marico Limited Bangladesh, Perfetti Van Melle, Godrej Consumer Products Bangladesh, etc. Currently, she is working with Bata Bangladesh as the Head of Marketing.

The event started with a conversation about Ms. Hasan's professional experience, the roles and responsibilities she carries out as a marketer. She said that, as the Head of Marketing of Bata Bangladesh, her current responsibilities include taking care of brand equity, building brand awareness and brand perception. From



her experience she shared some insights about suitable marketing strategies for lifestyle brands in the context of our country. According to her, the basics of marketing, like product development, highlighting and communication based on consumers' insight and demand are almost the same in every industry. Nevertheless, as the apparel brands market highly personalized products, successful marketing of such brands requires targeting the customer segmentation more thoroughly and detecting the touchpoints of them carefully. She mentioned that the influencers strategy works well as an add-on alongside traditional marketing techniques in such cases.

As a successful marketer, Ms. Hasan shared her opinion about the required and preferred skills to thrive in the current marketing industry. First of all, she mentioned soft skills like agility, flexibility, adaptivity, resilience, etc. as essential qualities for young marketers. Other than that, she emphasized acquiring basic knowledge about the functionality of other departments such as finance, supply chain and sales of the company. She also encouraged being familiar with the latest marketing tools and digital marketing. According to her, great observation skills are a must for doing well in the marketing sector. Alongside these, analytical ability, measure of effective-

ness of the applied tools and ability to adjust to the marketing strategies accordingly.

During the latter part of the event, Ms. Hasan shared memories and experiences from her NSU life. 
NGO Talk Show Episode 14



The fourteenth episode of the 'NGO Talk Show' aired on April 7, 2022 with one of the government-registered NGOs of Bangladesh - 'Arannayk Foundation'. The title of the event was 'Developing Bangladesh: Scope for research between NSU and Arannayk Foundation'. As the keynote speaker for the event, we had with us Mr. Rakibul Hasan Mukul, Executive Director, Arannayk Foundation. From North South University Dr. Katherine Li, Director, Office of External Affairs was present as a Special Guest, and Mr. Mehedi Masud Sumon, Officer, OEA hosted the live talk show.

The event started with a detailed overview of Arannayk Foundation from Mr. Mukul. Arannayk Foundation was founded in 2003 as a joint venture of the Bangladesh government and the American government under the US Tropical Forest Conservation Act. The organization started its journey with a grant of 8 million dollars from the government, a part of which was passed to other organizations as small grants for different projects. In this context, Mr. Mukul informed us that of the total fund, 5.99 million dollars was used to facilitate 167 grants for 71 different NGOs and research organizations. In fact, around 558 community-based organizations were also involved in the project.

As the discussion proceeded, the working areas and activities of the Arannayk Foundation were described. The organization mainly works for the conservation and improvement of forest and natural resources. It also has some experience in working directly with the government regarding policy advocacy and project implementation related to their working areas. During the discussion, Mr. Mukul mentioned that the Arannayk Foundation had direct involvement with two significant projects of the forest ministry – one is a project for forest restoration in 6 different reserved areas covering a nearly 25,000-hectare area and the other is a 'climate resilient afforestation and reforestation' project supported by the World Bank. Some other projects that are also administered by the Arannayk Foundation are the Village Common Forest, the knowledge development and survey – biodiversity conservation and ecosystem restoration and publications related to their working areas. The organization also worked with the government on livelihood program implementation, different tool development, socio-economic survey design for national forest inventory, survey conduction, collaborative forest management, water management etc. Currently, the Arannayk Foundation is especially focused on landscape and forest restoration, hilltrek restoration, livelihood of forest related population, etc.



Mr. Mukul has been involved with the development sector for a very long time and has 26 years of experience of working in the agriculture and natural resources reservation sector. As a veteran associate of the development sector, he shared some insights about the role of NGOs in the overall development of Bangladesh. According to him, the main strengths of NGOs are flexibility and connectivity. These two qualities enable them to reach the facilities, to help and service the grass-root level population of the country where the government has limited access. He mentioned that NGOs that have the same focus as theirs are helping people with climate change adaptation and climate change mitigation. In the process of improving forestry, the organization is also working to improve the lives of forest-related populations through administering alternative employment, health, education, gender sensitivity, etc. Ultimately, their actions and efforts regarding the actualization of the global commitment of the Bangladesh government to forest preservation which proposed 60% forest coverage and 25% increase of tree cover by 2030. In this context, Mr. Mukul appreciated the close involvement and support of the civil society in favor of their projects and activities.

The elaborate discussion about the working areas and interests of the Arannayk Foundation led the conversation towards the common fields and collaboration opportunities between NSU and the Arannayk Foundation. The guest proposed joint research projects with shared resources and funds based on the research foci and interests of the faculties of NSU. The involvement of international institutions and universities were also taken into account regarding collaborative research. Mr. Mukul also encouraged internship opportunities for the students of NSU at their organization. He also expressed interest in appointing the faculties and experts from NSU to be advisors for their projects and proposed to offer a platform for presenting innovative ideas and suggestions for the experts.

NSU Signs a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Badabon Sangho

After thorough discussion and comprehensive evaluation of common interests and objectives, North South University (NSU) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Badabon Sangho on April 7, 2022.

The MoU commences the scope of joint research and training activities through academic collaboration between NSU and Badabon Sangho which is expected to be beneficial for both the respective parties. It agrees upon the promotion of joint research and publication, exchange of research outcomes, primary data, academic publication and other academic information. According to the MoU, both the institutes will collaborate in organizing training programs on topics of mutual interest and internship opportunities will be offered in the areas of potential collaboration. The MoU also states that both NSU and Badabon Sangho will encourage research collaboration in areas of mutual interest. The agreement will remain effective for five years and shall automatically be renewed at the end of five years unless one or both of the institutes propose otherwise. Both NSU and Badabon Sangho will send written notices and consult with each other at least once a year prior to revision or termination of the agreement.

The fifteenth episode of the 'NGO Talk Show' aired on April 10, 2022 with one of the government-registered NGOs of Bangladesh - 'Center for Development Innovation and Practices (CDIP)'. The title of the event was 'Developing Bangladesh: Scope for research between NSU and CDIP. As the keynote speaker for the event, we had with us Mr. Mifta Naim Huda, Executive Director, Center for Development Innovation and Practices (CDIP). From North South University Dr. Katherine Li, Director, Office of External Affairs was present as a Special Guest, and Mr. Mehedi Masud Sumon, Officer, OEA hosted the live talk show.

The event started with the history of the foundation of CDIP. The organization started its journey in 1995. It was developed under joint stock without any funding from banks or donors. CDIP got its license after the establishment of the Microcredit Regulatory Authority and was finally registered by the government as an NGO in 2020. In the beginning, the organization started its operations with only two branches. Later on, it expanded its activities much further and currently has 181 branches operating in 27 distinct districts around the country having nearly 278,000 members and employees working for them.

The main objective of the operations and projects of CDIP is rural development in different sectors. Their main focus is sustainable development in microfinance. One of the very first initiatives of CDIP was 'Gram Tohobil', which promotes different income generating activities and the importance of saving to the rural population. Over the years, the organization has developed projects like collateral-free loans, microcredit, microfinance in agriculture, financial empowerment of women, etc. Alongside these, CDIP is also working for skill development and mitigation of knowledge gaps in the rural context regarding education, primary healthcare, family planning, pregnancy management, water and sanitation, etc. Overall, the organization's main objective is to increase the quality of life for all people of Bangladesh.

Besides discussing the activities and contributions of CDIP in the development sector, Mr. Huda also shared some valuable insights about the role of NGOs in the overall development of Bangladesh. He mentioned that NGOs have played different important roles in different phases of development. According to him, the most significant contributions of NGOs are regarding awareness raising, relief activities, skill development and financial empowerment of rural and disadvantaged people. These organizations have also worked efficiently for issues like the Rohingya crisis and COVID awareness in recent years. Mr. Huda also included that the govern-

ment has always guided the NGOs regarding these matters and helped them to play an implementation role.

As the discussion furthered, the topic of collaboration between NSU and CDIP was raised. Mr. Huda suggested collaborative research in areas of common interest for both the institutes and extended the offer to facilitate primary data collection, relevant field studies and visits. The guest also introduced their research publication wing to the attendees of the event which may be used to support joint publication projects. Studying Abroad: Things to Consider









North South University's Office of External Affairs (OEA) hosted a virtual information session with Education USA and Prime Bank Limited on April 10, 2022. As guests of the event, we had Mr. ANM Mahfuz Rahman, Deputy Managing Director, Prime Bank Ltd., Mr. Miah Mohammad Rabiul Hasan, Executive Vice President, Prime Bank Ltd., Mr. Shiblee Ahmed, National Sales Development Manager, Parkland Fuel Inc. USA, Mr. Sohel Iqbal, Director, Education USA, US Embassy and Rifat Swapnil, Library Coordinator, Education USA. From NSU, Dr. Katherine Li, Director, OEA, Ms. Samina Alam Miti, International Affairs officer and Ms. Antara Labiba, Guest Worker, OEA. The event was conducted through Zoom and streamed via Facebook Live on the official Facebook page of NSU OEA.

Throughout the session, the guests shared their opinions and remarks about the financial factors among other things to consider for studying abroad. The first speaker of the event was Mr. Rahman. He started his remarks with warm greetings to the attendees of the session. Afterwards, he explained the close association between Prime Bank and educational institutions. The bank has 146 branches around the country, among which 28 are authorized dealer branches which can facilitate student file related activities end-to-end. Five of their branches consist of special ambassadors for processing student files, student accounts, education loans and facilitating overseas education.

After Mr. Rahman's precise briefing, the floor was passed to Mr. Ahmed. As he studied abroad for his higher studies, he was able to share his experiences regarding the preparation, procedure and pursuance of a desired program at a desired institute. He also answered some of the frequently asked questions about studying abroad by the interested Bangladeshi students in the audience.



The third presenter of the session, Mr. Iqbal introduced the objectives and operations of EducationUSA through an informative presentation. He mentioned that the institute is a part of the US Department of State that helps to facilitate higher education opportunities for Bangladeshi students in the USA. Throughout his presentation, he informed the audience about their operating process and how to proceed with an application for an American university through them. He finished off his presentation by providing contact details of EducationUSA for the audience to reach out to them. The discussion was carried on further by Ms. Swapnil who described the academic services and resources that EducationUSA provides for preparation of the students. They also offer assistance regarding university research process, recommendation letters, personal essays writing, scholarships, academic certification like, GRE, GMAT, SAT, ACT, TOFEL, IELTS, etc.

The last speaker of the event was Mr. Hasan who integrated the overall discussion by explaining the role of banks in overseas studies. He especially focused on the process of transferring funds and discussed the usefulness of student files regarding the matter. He mentioned student files as an approved channel for converting currency, tuition fees, living expenses, application payment, insurance fees and other necessary financial activities for the students overseas. In this context, he mentioned the requirements for opening a student file and the support offered by Prime Bank Ltd. for education abroad.

In the latter part of the event, a very interactive Q&A session was hosted by Ms. Labiba where the speakers answered several commonly asked questions from the students. 
Meeting with Mariano Marcos State University, Philippines



Special Feature The Journey of Inspiration

his article features one of the most promising and inspirational members of the OEA, Mr. Shahanaj Uddin, Office Assistant, OEA. We will come to know about the inspiring journey of his academic and career life from the very beginning through this article.

Mr. Uddin grew up in a loving family of 10 members. His family was well off and his father was very supportive of his education until they started to face a financial crisis after the sudden death of his elder brother. The financial crisis forced him to work during his secondary education. Among all these difficulties and challenges, he passed the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) in 2015.

After his SSC, Mr. Uddin shifted to Dhaka in search of employment. With the help of one of his brothers, he set up a small grocery shop and started a business of his own in 2015. However, it didn't go well for him, thus he sold the shop within a month or two. Afterwards, he joined one of the restaurants located in the NSU canteen – 'Bahar Thai, Chinese and Indian Restaurant' as a salesperson. After working for one month in the post, he got promoted to supervisor. Mr. Uddin has this excellent quality of exerting his maximum effort, critically analyzing challenges and seeking creative solutions in whatever work he does. This quality led him to getting another promotion to cashier and then manager at the restaurant. Despite these challenges, he was still dreaming of getting admitted into college but couldn't make it yet.

In 2016, Mr. Uddin went to Qatar in search of a job and better earning. He couldn't manage to get a job there and on top of that, he got severely sick. Therefore, he couldn't stay for long in Qatar and returned to Bangladesh soon thereafter. After coming back, he rejoined the restaurant in the NSU canteen but that didn't last long either, as the restaurant closed their business at NSU.



Fortunately, right before the restaurant closed their operations, Mr. Uddin met Ms. Madiha and Ms. Miti, the Coordination Officer and International Affairs Officer of the OEA who were aware of his situation and sympathized with him. Ms. Madiha dropped his resume with their recommendation to the OEA and set up an interview with Dr. Li, the Director of the OEA. Although his interview didn't go well, because he couldn't say even a word during the interview due to nervousness, he got the job. He joined the OEA in January 2018 and got admitted into college two months later.

Mr. Uddin worked part-time at the OEA for one year, but after that NSU decided to let go of all the part-time employees and in that scenario, he lost his job. However, within this one year, Ms. Madiha applied for his permanent employment to the higher authorities and immediately after he lost his job, Dr. Li again sent a letter to the appropriate authorities for permanency of his position. That is how, eventually, he got his job back and has been working as a permanent Office Assistant in the OEA ever since. He never stopped his higher secondary education within these years and finally passed his Higher Secondary Certificate Examination (HSC) with GPA 4.90 in 2020 in Commerce.

After his HSC, everyone in the OEA encouraged him to pursue undergraduate studies. In fact, Dr. Hasanuzzaman, the Assistant Director guided him through the whole process of admission. Initially, he was admitted to Dhaka College under Open University; but later on, he shifted to University of Scholars, Bangladesh and got admitted in their BBA Program. He already had a merit scholarship of 50% from the university based on his previous academic performance and received an additional 35% waiver based on a recommendation from Dr. Li and Dr. Hasanuzzaman. His qualifications were acknowledged and waivers were approved by Mr. Abdul Hasib Siddique, CCO, University of Scholars. His mentor was, Mr. Atif Wafik, Coordinator of BBA program, University of Scholars, throughout this whole process and still is guiding him as his advisor. He has recently completed his first semester at the university with a CGPA of 3.87 on a scale of 4.00. He topped among the total of 214 students of his class. Moreover, he has been involved in extracurricular activities and currently and is currently the president of the Startup Club of his university.

Mr. Uddin mentioned that his target is to work with both entrepreneurship and academia. He appreciated the guidance, inspiration and support that he received from the OEA throughout his journey and expressed gratitude for the love he has experienced at the OEA. Upon reading this write-up, Dr. Li immediately added that Mr. Uddin is one of the most motivated and hardworking people she has ever met and imagines that he will go far in life. She has high expectations of him.

As a Guest Worker of the OEA, Ms. Labiba has the responsibility of supporting the Office of International Affairs (OIA). Zalved Hoss'ain received his BS degree in Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering from North South University (NSU), Bangladesh in 2010, and his MS and PhD degrees in Electrical Engineering from the University at Buffalo, State University of New York, UB in 2014 and 2018, respectively. From January 2010 to August 2012, he worked as a lab instructor at the EECS Department of NSU. He also worked as a lecturer in the same department and taught signals and systems during the Summer sessions of 2014-2017. He was the recipient of the Best Paper Award for ACM NanoCom in 2017. Currently, he is working as a wireless standards systems engineer at the Intel Corporation. His current research interests include modulation, channel modeling, multi-user interference modeling, protocol design, performance analysis and network simulation for Terahertz-band communication networks, with applications in terabit wireless personal and local area networks, next generation small cells, wireless nanosensor networks, and the internet of nano-things. He is a member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE).

Interviewer: Tell us about your work as a Wireless Standards Systems Engineer at Intel. What are the things that you love about your work?

Zahed Hossain: As one of the Wireless Standards Systems Engineer at the Intel Corporation, we research and develop potential technologies that can be incorporated in the next generation of wireless networks such as 5G/6G and wireless local area networks (WLAN). The most important thing I like about my work is that by developing next generation wireless technologies, our work enriches the experience of almost every person in the world. In addition, the passion for the wireless communication field took me to NSU to study Electronic and Telecommunication Engineering. Finally, the work environment and the culture of Intel Corporation makes me love my job.

Interviewer: How did you develop your interest in the areas of research like modulation, channel modeling, protocol design and network simulation?

Zahed Hossain: As I mentioned before, it all started with my passion for wireless communication. I used to watch the policemen using walkie-talkies and wondered how they worked! When I got into NSU and started learning about the concepts of modulation, wireless channel, networking protocols, etc., I decided that I was going to work in this field. During my doctoral studies, I got a chance to explore these concepts more and develop new modulation schemes, channel models and networking protocols for the next generation wireless communication at terahertz (THz) frequencies.

Interviewer: Tell us about your affiliation with IEEE. How does affiliation with associations such as this help an engineering graduate in his professional line of work?

Zahed Hossain: The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) is the world's largest technical professional organization dedicated to advancing technology for the benefit of humanity. I have been affiliated with IEEE since my undergraduate days at NSU. Being a member of IEEE, one gets to know the state-of-the-art technologies by reviewing the technical papers, attending conferences, as well as reading the tutorials and the IEEE magazines. The high-quality tutorials and

technical papers provide the foundation for researching and developing the next generation of technologies. In addition, it provides students an opportunity to do networking and get to know other people in the same field from around the world. As an example, some doctoral students meet their Ph.D. advisors for the first time at an IEEE conference.

Interviewer: How did NSU's education help you shape your career and become the person that you are today?

Zahed Hossain: NSU ensures that students have access to world class faculty members and curriculum. The textbooks and the course materials are aligned with the North American standards, so we had an easy time navigating through the schools in the US. The highly qualified teachers of NSU exposed us to the state-of-the-art knowledge base in our field and provided us with tools to understand them well. In addition, the faculty members were approachable and helpful during their office hours. Regular weekly quizzes and midterms helped us be disciplined and on track for the whole semester. The training NSU provided still helps me these days in my professional life.

Interviewer: What would be your career and life advice for the current students of NSU?

Zahed Hossain: My first piece of advice would be to utilize the good resources provided by NSU. Work hard to maintain a good GPA throughout your program – this will give you the technical skills you will need in professional life. Take your hands-on projects seriously, because this will give a better understanding of the subject matter. In addition, participate in some extra-curricular activities to increase your soft skills. Finally, try to do some higher studies abroad (at least a Master's degree). This will increase your knowledge in the field and provide you different perspectives for generating new ideas and inventions.

Yassin Jah is a Muslim of Gambian origin. I was born in Banjul, The Gambia. In the Gambia, I attended SOS Hermann Gmeiner throughout my basic and secondary education. After graduating from secondary school, I decided to further my computer education by enrolling in QuantumNet Institute of Technology.

Interviewer: What are your plans about further higher studies?

Yassin Jah: The online environment was very effective because lecturers were able to devise new methods of teaching that greatly aided students' comprehension. However, I prefer face-to-face classes because it increases the chances of effective communication which increases the tendency for us to give our full attention.

Interviewer: You have been staying in Bangladesh for a while now. Kindly share your opinion and observations about the people, language and culture of Bangladesh? How do you like it here?

Yassin Jah: The people of Bangladesh are extremely welcoming, and I feel very much at home. The language is interesting, and the culture is both beautiful and unique. It's quite different from Gambia, but I admire its uniqueness. Everything is special in a beautiful way.

Interviewer: Anything you want to share with or suggest to the future applicants of NSU?

Yassin Jah: Embrace learning opportunities.
